Practice with Problem Solving

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Topics:

Problem Solving, Recursion, Tree Diagrams

Purpose:

Students will develop and practice problem-solving techniques while solving a math story.

Materials:

'Tim and Doreen' Story

Time Required:

5 min.-Introduction, 25 min.-Group Work, 10 min.-Whole class discussion

Procedure:

- 1. Problem will be introduced to class.
- 2. Problem Solving Process will be reviewed in class.
- 3. Class will meet in groups to work on problems.
- 4. Groups will share their answers on the board.
- 5. Teacher can review recursive thinking and how it pertains to this problem.

Explorations:

Students can work to find a procedure that determines the number of people that know the secret in 'n' hours...using the first scenario from the sheet.

Assessment Tools:

- □ Group work on sheet.
- Informal observations.
- Work done on finding recursive formula in the exploration.
