The Biology of Icelandic Fishes

Biol 399 - International Field Studies

The International Field Studies Program in the Biological Sciences is offering a course in the biology of Icelandic fishes. There are no prerequisites and all Biology majors and minors are welcomed. The course will be taught at Hólar University in Iceland and will give students the opportunity to study the ecology, physiology, behavior and evolution of Icelandic fishes in their natural setting.

Hólar is in northern Iceland in the Hjaltadalur valley of the Skagafjörður district. The area is renowned for horse breeding and training and for heritage tourism. The University is near the city of Sauðárkrókur, the second-largest town on the north coast of Iceland. The setting allows students to study the biology of Arctic fishes within a few miles of the Arctic Circle while enjoying a mild climate.
