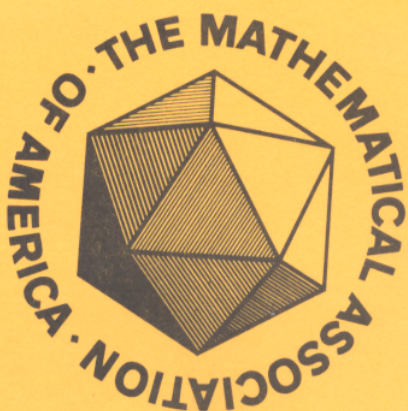

Report of the Board of Governor's Meeting  
August 6, 1989

The meeting started at 8:30 a.m. and lasted until 4:45 p.m. During this time, every single vote was unanimous, so you can tell just how exciting the meeting was. Of interest to the section was the confirmation of the award to John Smith for outstanding contributions to the section. This award is presented to a member of our section once every 5 years. The presentation will be at the MAA business meeting during the National meeting in January. If you are in Louisville for the meeting, be sure to attend the business meeting and cheer (or boo) when John receives the award. Martha Siegel from Towson State and one of the main speakers at our upcoming section meeting was appointed Editor of Mathematics Magazine despite her request that I vote against her.

One item that will be of interest to some of our members was the vote to authorize the Executive and Finance Committee to negotiate with the AMS to have joint summer meetings in odd numbered years. This vote was made with regret by the Board. The AMS has for several years expressed a desire to eliminate summer meetings because the attendance is so low and both organizations lose money. The vote does not necessarily mean that there will be no summer meetings in even numbered years. The executive and Finance Committee is looking into the possibility of holding joint summer meetings with another organization.

Right before lunch, the Board broke up into small groups in the hope that this would generate discussion on various topics. My group choose to discuss the fact the the MAA journals do not provide enough in the way of "State of the profession" type articles. In fact, it was felt that the best source for this type of article was the AMS Notices. This sentiment was also present in two of the reports to the Board. Both the Committee on Minority Representation and the Ad Hoc Committee on Publications stated that the MAA Journals should have more articles of this type. During the general discussion on this topic, there was much support of this idea. However, it was also felt that each journal editor should have complete control of the contents of that journal. If you have any thoughts on this topic, let me know.

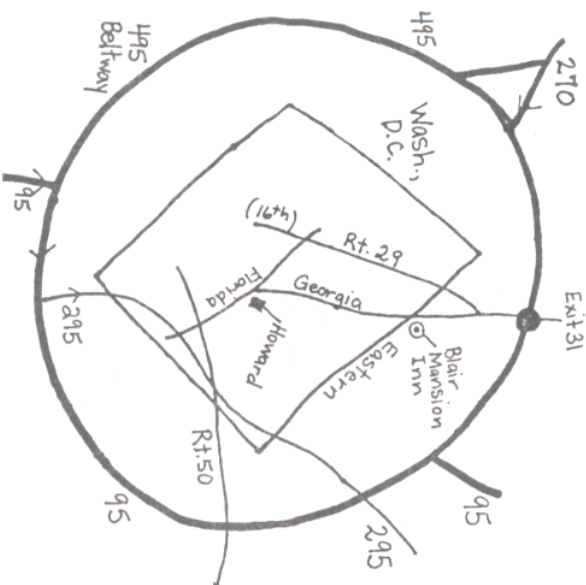
## \* \* Directions to Howard University \* \*

**From the North and West:** Take 495 to Georgia Ave., exit #31 and follow Georgia Ave. south. Howard is about 4.5 miles south of DC - MD line (formed in part by Eastern Ave.)

**From the South:** Take 95 north to Washington beltway. Stay on 95 going east and north to 295 north. Take 295 north to route 50 west. Rt. 50 to Florida Ave. (north or west) to Georgia. Go north on Georgia Ave. to Howard's campus, almost immediately on your right.

**From the East:** See directions from the south, starting at Rt. 50.

# Guest Speakers

**PROFESSOR ROBERT L. DEVANEY**  
**BOSTON UNIVERSITY**

A graduate of Holy Cross College, who received his Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley, Professor Robert Devaney has been on the Mathematics faculty at Boston University since 1980, chairing the department from 1983 to 1986. Author of almost 50 publications, his most recently-published book bears the name of his talk for our meeting, "Chaos, Fractals, and Dynamics: Computer Experiments in Mathematics."

**PROFESSOR DAVID A. SMITH**  
**DUKE UNIVERSITY**

Currently the Co-Director of Project CALC (Calculus as a Laboratory Course) at Duke University, Professor David Smith received his Bachelor's degree from Trinity College and his Ph.D. from Yale. At the Joint Meetings of the AMS/MAA in Phoenix, Professor Smith and a colleague, George Gopen, presented a popular Minicourse, "Writing in Mathematics Courses", of which his presentation here is a more restricted version. He is also the author of the Saunders text, Interface: Calculus and the Computer.

**PROFESSOR MARCIA P. SWARD**  
**MATHEMATICAL ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA**

Newly-appointed Executive Director of the Mathematical Association of America, Professor Sward is a Summa cum laude graduate of Vassar College, and received her masters and doctoral degrees from the University of Illinois. After several years at Trinity College in Washington, DC, she began her professional career as Associate Director of the MAA, followed by four years as Director of the National Research Council's Mathematical Sciences Education Board.

The Maryland-District of Columbia-Virginia Section of the MAA is pleased to announce that Professor John Smith will receive a MAA Certificate of Meritorious Service to honor his many contributions to the MAA at both the national and local levels. This award will be presented to Dr. Smith at the 1990 winter meeting of the MAA to be held in Louisville.

John M. Smith has been a member of the Mathematical Association of America since 1962. He has served the Maryland-District of Columbia-Virginia Section as Secretary (1972-76), Vice-Chairman for Programs (1976-78), Chairman Elect (1978-79), Newsletter Editor (1978-79), Chairman (1979-81), Past Chairman (1981-82), and Governor (1983-86). He has also served the Association as a member of the Committee on Sections (1985-present), and as a member of the Program Committee for the the Salt Lake City, Atlanta, Phoenix, Boulder, and Louisville meetings. He is also a member of the American Mathematical Society, the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, the Virginia Council of Teachers of Mathematics, and the Fairfax County Association of Mathematics Teachers, and has served on a number of committees for these organizations.



Professor Smith has been a member of the faculty of George Mason University since 1966, and has previously taught at Georgetown University and the University of Maryland. He holds a B.S. degree from the University of Richmond, a M.A. and a Ph.D. from the University of Maryland.

Professor Smith has also been active in his community, Vienna, VA, where he has been an active member and officer of several PTAs, the chairman of a Boy Scout Troop Committee for the past eight years, a Cub Scout leader, and an active member of his church. He and his wife Judy have been married for 30 years and have four children.
